Many different groups of people have migrated to Britain and still do	Migration	Movement of people from one country to another
There are many reasons why people migrate	Immigration	When a person moves to a country for a long period of time
<u>PUSH</u> factors - have to leave (war, famine, lack of education, persecution etc.)	Push factors	Something that forces someone out of their country or home
<u>PULL</u> factors - family, good education, healthcare, safety, climate etc	Pull factors	Moving to a country because there is something there that is good, liked or needed
What's <u>POSITIVE</u> / <u>NEGATIVE</u> <u>SIMILAR</u> / <u>DIFFERENT</u> in experiences of migrants	Empire Windrush	People from the Caribbean came to the UK to offer help after the war
Cultural diversity in the UK - a positive impact. Migration has influenced our streets, fashion, art, music, events, food, restaurants	Caribbean	A group of islands where the Windrush generation came from
