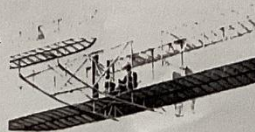

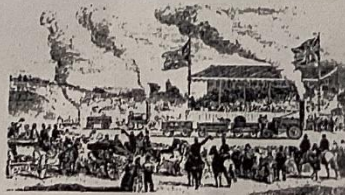
Lesson 1 The first flight was in 1903.
